3/14/25: Deadline for written entries is 4PM, Friday, March 14, 2025

3/28/25: Winning essayists and the teachers they honor are notified by email and invited to the awards ceremony. 4/22/25: Awards Ceremony for all winning essayists and the teachers they honor takes place at 7 PM @ at Central Library in downtown Harrisonburg.

PRIZE Categories - one winning essay and one runner up are selected per the following grade levels:

- K-2nd: \$150 winning essay \$100 runner-up
- 3rd-5th: \$150 winning essay \$100 runner-up
- 6th-8th: \$150 winning essay \$100 runner-up
- 9th-12th: \$150 winning essay \$100 runner-up
- Honored Teacher of the Year: \$1,500! One of the teachers honored from all categories above will be selected as the "Honored Teacher of the Year" and will receive a cash prize of \$1,500 to be used for their own professional development. The Honored Teacher of the Year is kept secret until the end of the Awards Ceremony event.

CONTEST GUIDELINES

The Robert B. and Gladys Hopkins Strickler Honored Teachers Essay Contest is open to all K-12 students in the City of Harrisonburg, Page County and Rockingham County, whether they attend public, private, or home schools.

- Entry form must be completed in its entirety, accompany the essay, and be signed by the student entering (or by proxy of parent/guardian name as noted on the form). No electronic signatures will be permitted.
- Essays must be original work by the student; parents and/or teachers should refrain from assisting with content, word choice, or other editorial input.
- Only one entry allowed per student.
- Submitted entries cannot be returned but will be sent to the teacher honored within one month of the Awards Ceremony.
- Due to volume of essays received, receipt of entries cannot be confirmed.
- Winning essayists will be notified at the email listed on the form. Please do not use a restricted school email address.
- Deadline for submissions: 4PM Friday, March 14, 2025.

Grades 9-12: 250-500 words total telling us about a teacher who has really made a difference in your life.

<u>Grades K-8:</u> 250 words or less telling us about your favorite teacher. Children in grades 2 or younger are permitted to have an adult transcribe their dictated essay and may also include any artwork that relates to their teacher, along with their essay.

CONTEST JUDGING

Members of the Harrisonburg Kiwanis Club annually volunteer to judge MRL's contest. Every year we receive hundreds of outstanding entries, and the judges often have to make very hard decisions between many deserving essays. All decisions of the judges are final however, and we thank you for your understanding. When reading the essays, the judges look for:

- well-planned themes
- excellent grammar and spelling skills, and word choice
- essay originality
- specific evidence of outstanding teaching and student appreciation.
